Brigid Imrie Award

Brigid Imrie attended Diocesan School from 1980 to 1984. She died at the age of 31 in February 1998 after a lengthy battle with cancer. In 1998 her friends launched an appeal to set up an award in memory of her. It was first awarded in 1999.

Brigid is remembered as an exceptional person, with an unselfish commitment to meeting the needs of others. The injustices and misfortunes of others distressed her, and she championed the cause of those on the margins. She was honest and generous and had a great sense of fun. She was also an avid reader who 'devoured books' with a passion.

These qualities and attributes are to be recognised in the recipient. The terms of the award require a student of year 12 to be nominated by her peers. That student will have shown herself to stand out from the rest and to have "made a difference" either in the lives of her fellow classmates or in the community as a whole. The recipient receives Book Tokens that reflect Brigid's love of reading
